All of our original and replica equipment, including Turner Centre Dairying Association car #65, will be used to demonstrate mixed and freight trains commonly operated on the old WW&F.

Our event will run from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m.

and will include the firing up of No. 9 in the morning and a staged and lit night scene.

Several unique photograph opportunities will be provided throughout the day.

Last operated in 1933, 125-year-old WW&F locomotive #9 awoke from an 82-year slumber to power many of our Museum's Victorian Christmas trains in December. Built by the Portland Company in Maine in 1891, she is the last surviving locomotive from the Sandy River & Rangeley Lakes, Kennebec Central and Wiscasset, Waterville & Farmington railroads! After a 9+ years' effort, our Museum restored her to service late last year.

Price is \$100 per person.

Seats will be limited to 50 people. If attendance sells out, a second Photographic Excursion will run Thursday, April 28th.
